

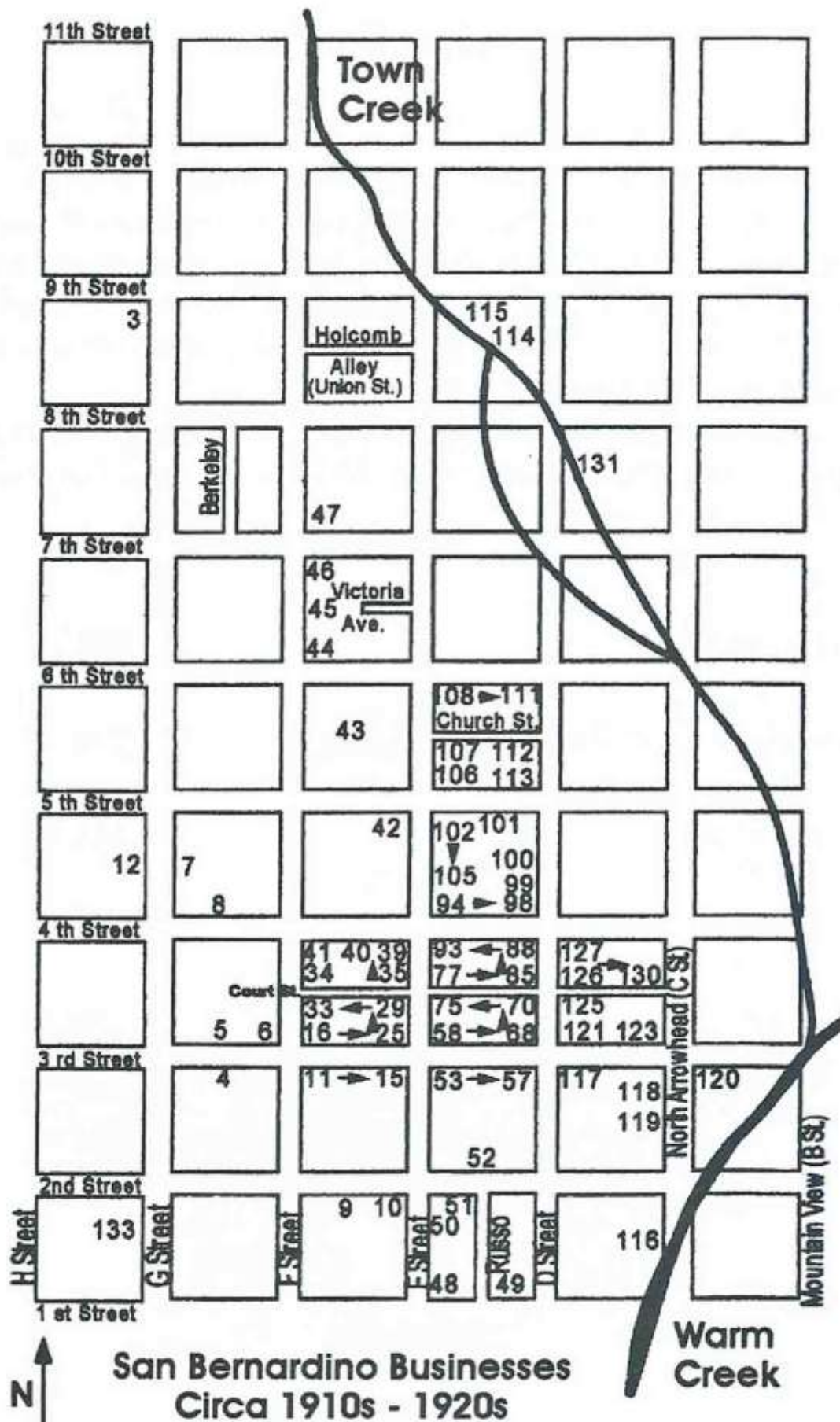
## Maps

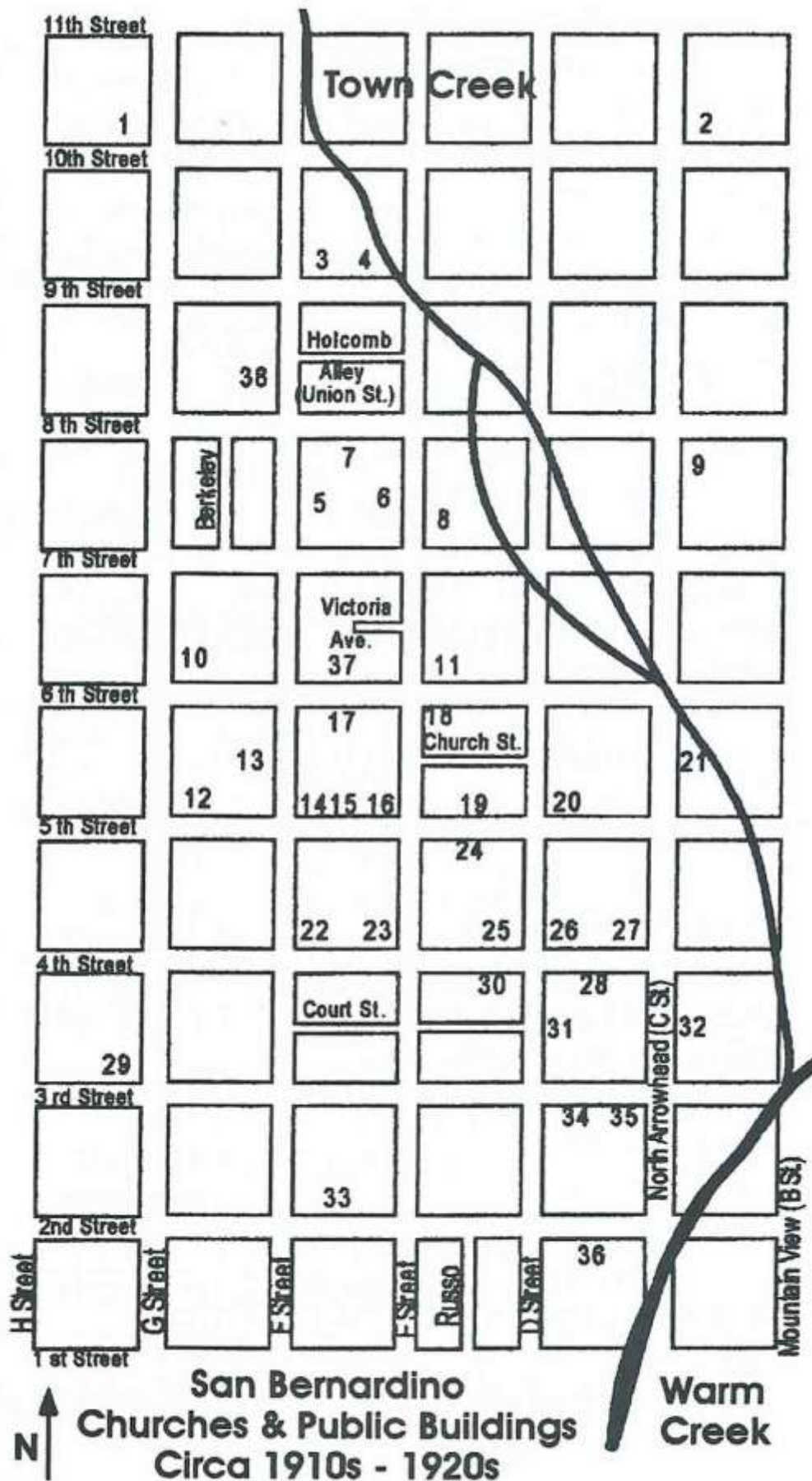

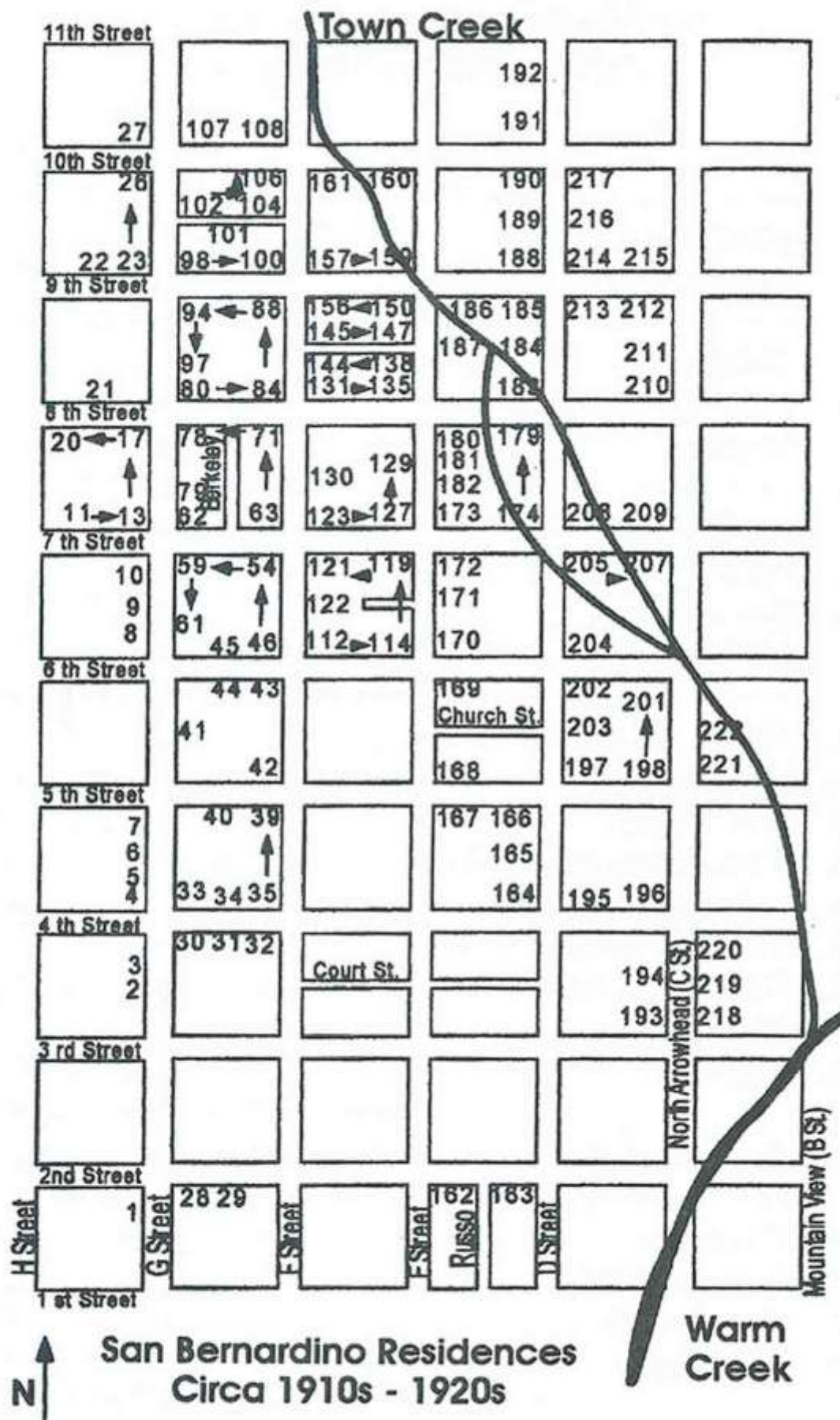
